The place and role of communities in food policy

The DSFB is an agricultural and food policy that is intended to be systemic - from production to consumption - and that responds to a variety of issues. Since 2014, it has been coordinating a programme aimed at relocating food as much as possible in the valley and promoting access to quality food for all, with ambitious numerical objectives: 80% organic and/or local products in collective catering, 50% UAA in AB. In 2019, the CCVD led a consultation process to build its 2020-2023 food strategy, involving around fifty stakeholders and 250 inhabitants. This new strategy seeks to broaden the scope of target audiences, actions and partnerships. Beyond the actions on installation, structuring of local industries and marketing, which are still ongoing, the new actions deployed concern education, learning by the inhabitants, access for all to quality food, with the challenge of reaching those who are today far from sustainable consumption patterns. The CCVD coordinates this strategy and leads the extended governance, which is currently being built and experimented.
